25% of this diocesan collection goes to support our own diocesan mission work, mainly our association with Sucre, Bolivia, where we've sent missionaries since 1994.

**THE CREED Video Series:** Using this new film series blending documentary conversations and dynamic talks, we will view Bishop Robert Barron as he guides us into the depths of the Nicene Creed, a 4th-Century statement of faith that has profoundly influenced Christian spirituality, theology, and liturgy. Sr. Myra Lambert, sscm, will facilitate the viewing of the video and a follow-up discussion for each session. **The series will be shown on Wednesdays from 6:30—8:00 p.m. on the following dates: January 26, February 23, March 23, April 27, May 25 and June 22.**

**Story: The Heart of Intergenerational Catechesis:** Please join us on **Thursday, February 3**, from 9:00—11:00 a.m. for this presentation given by Dr. Timone Davis, Assistant Professor, Institute of Pastoral Studies, Loyola University Chicago. Dr. Davis' method of African-American storytelling, *My Story—Your Story*, brings to life the Christian story through our shared experiences. At the heart of intergenerational catechesis is a story, which invites us to see one another across time. Faith formation that focuses on intergenerational catechesis using African—American storytelling highlights our connections, where we are then able to see ourselves and others transformed.

**Restorative Justice: Co-Creating A New Heaven and New Earth:** Please join Dr. KC Crino, Area Director/Catalyst, One Collective, on **Thursday, February 10** from 6:30—8:00 p.m. as he leads a discussion of restorative justice and restorative justice practices as a means to heal wounds, unite what has fallen apart, and to bring home those who have lost their way.
