2022 marked the St. Peter's Lutheran Food Tent's **60**th year at the Iroquois County Fair! The success of an event of this magnitude would not be possible without the generous support from our surrounding communities, busi-





nesses, and fellow congregations. We are reaching out, once again, to area churches for dessert donations. On average, we serve 400-500 people daily. We anticipate needing 200-300 dessert portions per day of the fair (6 days).
